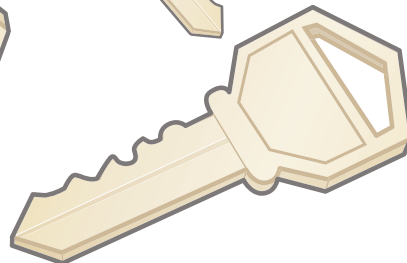
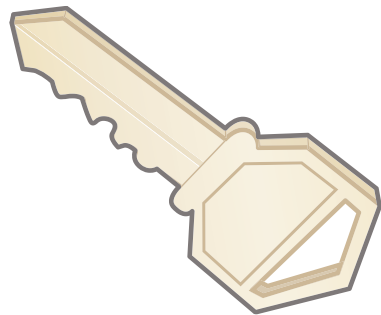
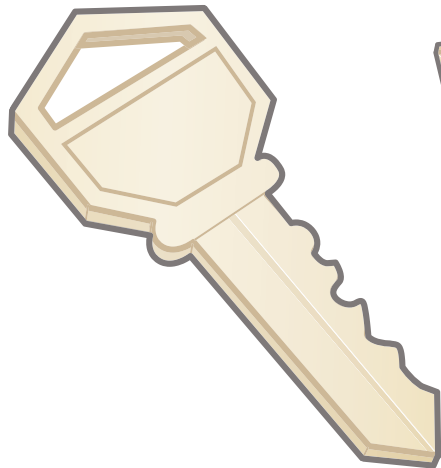
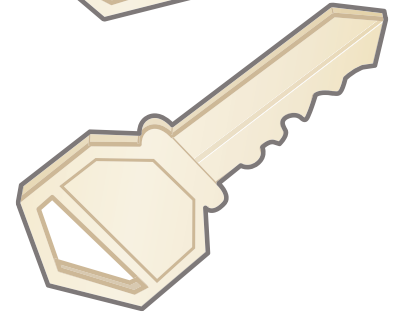
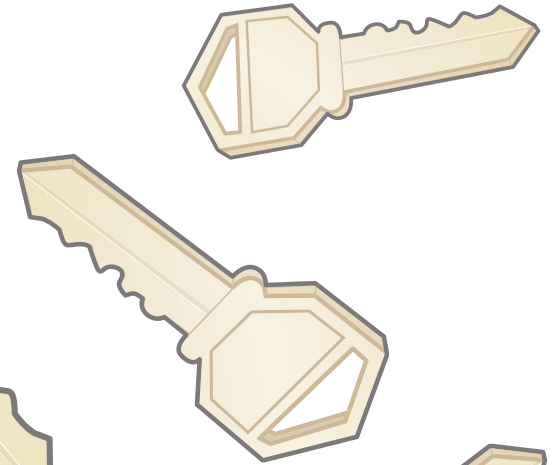
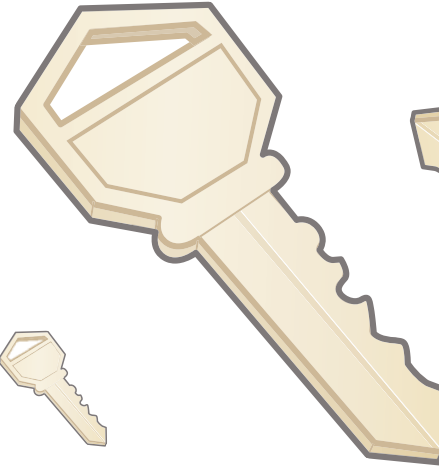
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




8. Most of all maintain the flow. If you get too caught up on tricky words, choose a slightly easier book.

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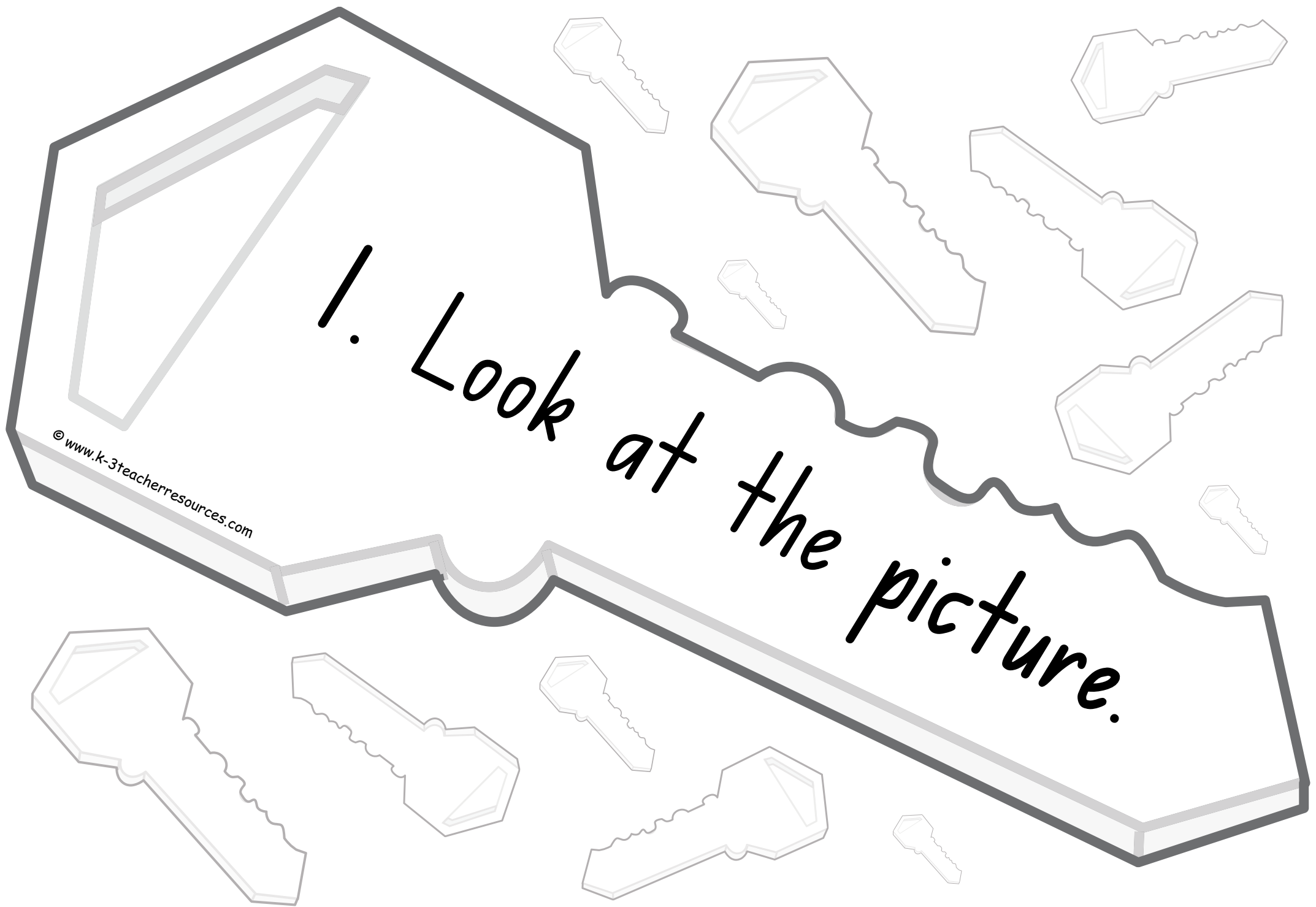
